PRE-CANCEROUS STATES

Der Vorkrebs. By Dr. med. Corneliu Popescu. (Pp. 190 + ix; illustrated. DM. 29.80.) Jena: Gustav Fischer Verlag. 1962.

When reading this monograph one realizes how important for cancer research, cancer prevention, and cancer treatment would be a more detailed knowledge of pre-cancerous states (*Vorkrebs*).

The author, perhaps in a somewhat long-winded manner, attempts to assess critically this concept, which is rejected by some experts, strongly defended by others, and anyhow difficult to establish in deep-set tumours. After considering "the complex of pathophysiological phenomena, divisible into three groups "—that is, local factors, general disturbances or the participating of the whole organism, and harmful external factors—Dr. Popescu pursues his theme by assembling a considerable number of facts and by discussing morphological and aetiological observations concerning the clinical pictures of pre-cancerous states.

It is a great pity that these morphological observations have to stand on their own and are not supported by corresponding studies of biological and biochemical behaviour of the pre-cancerous tissue. However, here and there in the literature can be found reports on timedependent changes in the amount or distribution of certain cellular constituents occurring during the period of "carcinogenesis"; these at present are far from comprehensive and come mainly from experiments on animals. But if such work could be extended to a great number of human cancers and one could, for instance, follow through in a patient (the difficulties here of course are great) the development of the final state of neoplasia, say from the early stages of leukoplakia, then the attempted treatment of pre-cancerous states as discussed by the author under the main heading of cancer prevention (Chapter 5) would lead to more pronounced success.

There are some statements made throughout the book with which one could take issue with Dr. Popescu, particularly when he flogs the pretty dead horse of "Lysenkoism." But if one overlooks these and other deficiencies this monograph could form a useful addition to the libraries of institutes and hospitals engaged in cancer work.
