Each chapter has a full bibliography. The editors have also assembled in the book an admirable collection of portraits of the great pioneers in cardiovascular physiology.

Mycological Techniques

Diagnostic Medical Mycology. By Leanor D. Haley, Ph.D. (Pp. 204 + x; illustrated. \$4.95.) New York: Appleton-Century-Crofts. 1964.

This little book is written primarily for the use of technicians trained in bacteriological methods. It is therefore, as it should be, primarily concerned with methods of processing material suspected of being pathogenic. It consists of 22 chapters, each with references, and an appendix and index.

The first chapter provides a taxonomic outline of the fungi, which is excellent as far as it goes, and is probably adequate, as most bacteriological technicians at least have the opportunity of following some course or other in elementary mycology. The second chapter, on the collection of the different types of clinical material, and those that follow, mostly on specialized methods appropriate for dealing with particular fungal pathogens suspected of being present in the material, are excellent and of great value in this respect. Unfortunately in these some of the mycology is inaccurate. For example, it is incorrect to state that the microconidia in the genus Microsporum are "round," because in fact they are characteristically elongate. It is also incorrect to state categorically that the varieties interdigitale and granulare of Trichophyton mentagrophytes are not distinguishable microscopically from T. rubrum. The shape of the microconidium (mainly rounded or pip-shaped in these varieties and mainly elongate in T. rubrum) and the manner in which they are produced (mainly

grappe" in these varieties and mainly "en thyrse" in T. rubrum) serve to distinguish these varieties from T. rubrum. Moreover spiral hyphae are developed in most strains, whereas they are rare in T. rubrum. It is true that some strains of these varieties are difficult to distinguish microscopically from T. rubrum and for this reason other criteria may be more reliable. Chapter 21 on special techniques for the microscopical study of many of the organisms mentioned in the previous chapters is useful; so also is chapter 22 on the composition of culture media and reagents. Finally the appendix summarizes admirably, for the most part, the principal diagnostic features of these fungal pathogens.

The text is clearly printed on matt-surfaced paper and appropriately though sparingly illustrated with clear photomicrographs and line drawings and bound between stiff paper with green glossy surface. A good guide to technique and a book worth buying for this reason, at only 4 dollars 95 cents (36 shillings).
