

## Medical History Illustrated

**An Illustrated History of Medicine.** By Roberto Margotta. (Pp. 324. 63s.) London: Paul Hamlyn. 1968.

Of the several illustrated histories of medicine that have been published, this is probably the most sumptuous and the most original in pictorial content. The illustrations, many of them in excellent colour, have been mostly reproduced from primary sources and it is a pleasure to see so many that have not appeared before in other examples of this kind of book. Altogether the book is a credit to the Italian firm that has produced it.

Unfortunately the text, to which the illustrations are secondary, although well written is not as praiseworthy. The author's laudable

aim is to provide "in simple terms, a picture of the main stages of medicine in its evolution through the centuries" and as a continuing process set against the general background of civilization. But the story is unbalanced, so that more space is devoted to earlier periods than is warranted, owing perhaps to the more dramatic pictorial material available to illustrate them. There are a number of errors which taken separately are perhaps of little consequence, but when collected together are more serious. There is an unwarranted emphasis on Italian contributions, exemplified best by the usual attempt to magnify the significance of Cesalpino's writings on the circulation of the blood, and by the mention of Matteucci's but not of Du Bois-Reymond's work on electrophysiology.

The section on the nineteenth century, although dealing with the essential and dramatic topics such as anaesthesia, military medicine, nursing, antisepsis and asepsis,

infection, x-rays, and nervous and mental diseases, provides no overall view of medical advances in this period. There are several striking omissions, and certain areas of knowledge such as the neurological sciences are dealt with, albeit inadequately, while other equally important medical sciences are neglected. Finally, it is not at all clear why most of the illustrations for the final section, "Medicine in modern society," should be Russian in origin. The book has no reference to textual sources and the index is too brief.

It is admittedly very difficult to write a short account of the evolution of medicine, but it is regrettable that the author could not have composed a more balanced, impartial, and accurate synopsis which would have matched the brilliance of his illustrations and the gracefulness of his prose.
