

Nuclear Medicine at Hull

A new department of nuclear medicine was opened at Hull Royal Infirmary by the chairman of the Humber Area Health Authority, Sir John Dudding, on 5 December. A conference on the applications of the gamma camera and linked computer, part of the department's equipment and the most modern in Europe, was held on the same day.

Frederic Wood Jones

A volume comprising sketches of Wood Jones's life and work by Sir Arthur Keith, Sir Wilfred LeGros Clark, Sir Sydney Sunderland, and Professor K. F. Russell, together with a bibliography of 362 of his published works has recently been compiled by a doctor in Melbourne. Wood Jones, F.R.C.S. (1879-1954) was professor of anatomy in Adelaide, Hawaii, and Melbourne, and occupied the chair at Manchester. His last appointment was as Sir William Collins professor and conservator of the museum at the Royal College of Surgeons in London, where he did much to rebuild the Hunterian Collection, severely damaged by bombing in the second world war. *A List of the Published Works of Frederic Wood Jones (1879-1954)*, Barry E.
