disabled people in their own homes, even when living alone, the investigators looked into the types of alarm systems such people had-if any-and their effectiveness and quality. Guidelines are given for identifying people at risk, and advice on the selection of alarm systems and their maintenance. #### **Audiovisual Aids**

In order to make audiovisual tapes more readily available to medical students and to discuss the cost of preparing these, a small group was formed in 1974 under the auspices of the Medical Recording Foundation. This group, designated the Medical Producers' Association, Audiotape-Slide borrowed tapes made by its members so that these could be copied by others, or made available to the general medical public through the Recording Service's library.

To date, people from 19 medical schools are working with this group and tapes on the following subjects are available: endocrinology, obstetrics and gynaecology, surgery, family planning, and anaesthetics. Others are in production. Members of the association invite medical schools to join them, so that they may have the opportunity of hearing about, and making use of, tapes already in use, and exchange others already available.
