In "Priorities and expenditure" (28 February, p 513) the third sentence in the first paragraph under the heading "Public expenditure" should read: "In this coming year, April 1976 to April 1977, current expenditure on the NHS overall will have a growth rate of 2.6% measured in real terms and personal social services 3.8%. Over the following three years the situation will be much tighter but we will still have a real economic growth rate in current expenditure of 1.8% in the NHS and 2% in the personal social services."
