NAHA

The annual report for 1978-9 of the National Association of Health Authorities describes how its work as a pressure group and central services agency has grown largely in response to emerging demands such as a request for comments from the Royal Commission on the NHS. During the year the association has been particularly concerned by the interference of the DHSS in the management of industrial disputes and by the underfunding of nationally agreed pay settlements. The association wants a reduction in direct Government involvement in the running of the Service and considers that this would increase health authorities' sense of responsibility for their services and "help to increase the sense of collective responsibility for action over such matters as Normansfield."

New cancer research laboratory

The Yorkshire Cancer Research Campaign has agreed to provide a new laboratory for cancer research, to be built in the grounds of Cookridge Hospital, Leeds, and operated by the University's department of radiotherapy. The laboratory is now in the early planning stage. Completion is planned for 1980 or early 1981, and the total cost is expected to be about £500 000.

Information on safety at work

All the publications issued by the Health and Safety Commission and Executive since 1968—about 1500 items—are listed in the Health and Safety Executive *Publications Catalogue '79*. The catalogue costs £1 and is published by HMSO.

Raised prescription and dental charges

The increases in prescription and dental charges announced in last week's budget will take effect from 16 July. Prescription charges go up from 20p to 45p, to bring in an extra £40m yearly; 45p will cover about one-fifth of the average cost of a prescription. About 60% of prescriptions bear no charge and exemptions from charges will continue for the same groups as at present. Increased dental charges will raise an extra £20m yearly. For most courses of treatment the maximum charge will increase from £5 to £7. The overall maximum charge for more expensive work, such as supplying dentures, will be £36.

Wellcome senior lectureships

The Wellcome Trust has introduced a plan to pay for a substantial number of Wellcome senior lectureships in medical science. Announcing the scheme in its report for 1976-8 the Trust says that appointees, who will be given five-year initial contracts, will undertake normal departmental duties, "thus stimulating and creating more time for

research" within their departments as a whole.

Kidney transplants

The number of kidney transplants undertaken in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland for the month ending 31 May was 90, and the number of potential recipients on file was 1336. Corresponding figures for the previous month were 79 and 1323.

Instructions to authors

The following are the minimum requirements for manuscripts submitted for publication.

A stamped addressed envelope or an international reply coupon must accompany the manuscript if acknowledgment of its receipt is desired.

(1) **Typing** should be on one side of the paper, with double or triple spacing between the lines and 5-cm margins at the top and left-hand side of the sheet.

(2) **Two copies** (or preferably three) should be submitted.

(3) **Spelling** should conform to that of *Chambers Twentieth Century Dictionary*.

(4) **References** must be set out in the style used in the *BMJ*, and their accuracy verified before the manuscript is submitted.

(5) **SI units** are used for scientific measurements. In the text they should be followed by traditional units in parentheses. In tables and illustrations values are given only in SI units, but a conversion factor must be supplied. For general guidance on the International System of Units, and some useful conversion factors, see *The SI for the Health Professions* (WHO, 1977).

(6) **Authors** should give their names and initials, their current appointments, and not more than two degrees or diplomas. Each author must sign the covering letter as evidence of consent to publication.

(7) **Letters to the Editor** submitted for publication must be signed personally by all the authors.

(8) **Acknowledgments** will not be sent unless a stamped addressed envelope or an international reply coupon is enclosed.

(9) **Detailed instructions** are given in the *BMJ* dated 6 January 1979 (p 6).
