THE VALUE OF MEDICAL PROTECTION.—We are informed that a member of the London and Counties Medical Protection Society was, some time back, arrested by the Japanese police on board ship, by mistake for an individual of the same name. As a result of representations made by the Society to the Foreign Office, the Japanese Government has now decided that, while maintaining that the claim for compensation could not be entertained in accordance with the law of the country, they will grant the complainant as a matter of courtesy and grace the sum of £30 in view of the annoyance and inconvenience to which he has been put.

LECTURES ON BACTERIOLOGY AT PLYMOUTH.—The Plymouth Education Authority has appointed Dr. F. Bushnell to deliver a course of bacteriological lectures for medical men, veterinary surgeons, agriculturists, brewers, farmers, sanitary inspectors, teachers, and others. These will be illustrated by lantern slides, cultures and demonstrations, and it is hoped to make arrangements for a class of practical bacteriology in the future.
