

clearly. Skilful, competent, painstaking, sympathetic, and sufficiently self-assured, he inspired his patients with confidence and that is half the battle. By refusing to have a telephone in his consulting-room he gave every patient his undivided attention. Every young medical aspirant would do well to note how carefully the waiting- and consulting-rooms were arranged, though a gas fire had to be substituted for the more welcome coal fire "as so many people would poke it to relieve their feelings."

Many stories about famous patients are related, and we are told that on one occasion the author helped to prepare a royal speech. Dr. Byam was responsible for popularizing "boldo"; how popular this now little-known medicine became may be judged by the telegram received from an impatient colonel: "Kindly send me more of Byam's boldo for bilious bodies—we are all drinking it in the club."

After his retirement from practice Dr. Byam showed great public spirit by consenting to become the first director of the Princess Tsahai Memorial Hospital in Addis Ababa.
