surgery at Columbus, Ohio, and has reviewed the scope and limitations of such tests in a useful and fair-minded survey. It will be of substantial value to those who are concerned with the clinical evaluation of renal function but are unfamiliar with this branch of what the author refers to as "medical isotopetry."

Written in a narrative and illustrative way, the book contains a great deal of practical information and good sense, particularly in its emphasis on broad conclusions and the dangers of over-interpretation, even if this implies that the treatment is less analytical or quantitative than might have been possible. It would have been useful to have had, for example, numerical data on normal ranges rather than simple assertions of the limits ascribable to "moderate" or "marked" decrease in function, and a clearer definition of the phase of the renogram tracing (of the renal content of labelled hippuran after its intravenous injection) attributed to the "functional segment." For normal kidneys this phase of increasing uptake is shown to reflect tubular activity in concentrating the test substance, and to be terminated by a falling count rate when excretion predominates. The pattern is characteristically altered, however, when excretion from the kidney is impaired by obstruction, or in anuria, when the counting rate rises abnormally.

The text is copiously illustrated with tracings and examples of the scope of the test, so much so in fact that an interrupted sentence may be resumed nine pages later. Because of this a clearer difference between the types used for figure legend and text would have been helpful. It would also have been useful to have a more quantitative statement of the radiation exposures attributable to the various nuclides employed, however small, and to any fractional long-term retention that may be involved. The book remains, however, a thoroughly useful compilation of evidence as to the routine use of a clinically valuable test.
