are sections of general interest. Chapters VI and VII, which deal respectively with Walter Reed and with typhoid immunization, are of outstanding interest. The author is in error in stating that Almroth Wright made the first trial of the vaccine in India. It was made on volunteers from his class at Netley.

The modern institute is a splendid pathological centre which deals annually with 60,000 cases referred to it for an opinion, conducts postgraduate courses, provides sets of slides for classes elsewhere, accommodates and supplies staff for maintaining various pathological registries, and conducts an upto-date department for medical illustration. It is an institution of national importance.

One incident well merits quotation. Walter

Reed was a member of a commission which had to inspect and report on the sanitation of camps. They visited the camp of the Third Nebraska Voluntary Infantry and asked the colonel to accompany them. When the inspection was over Reed said to the colonel: "Shakespeare and Vaughan are on this Commission because they know something of camp sanitation. I am here because I can damn a colonel," after which he spoke his mind to the colonel, who happened to be William Jennings Bryan.

The results of an investigation into the arrangements for old people in Lewisham

have been published by a committee sponsored by the King Edward Hospital Fund for London. The report covers sickness in hospital, at home, and in welfare accommodation, as well as many general matters. This particular area was chosen because the Lewisham Group has no special geriatric units and no geriatric physician. The committee were split on what they thought about this. Most of them were satisfied with the arrangements made in the area for those who were elderly and ill, but a minority held that Lewisham ought to have a special geriatric unit.
