Drugs for Mental Disease

Psychopharmacological Agents. Vol. 1. Edited by Maxwell Gordon. (Pp. 678+xvi; illustrated. £8 8s.) New York and London: Academic Press. 1964.

This book is welcome for the excellent description which it gives of the development of some 12 groups of drugs designed for alleviating mental disease. Its clinical sections are brief and secondary. The classification is chemical, and the presentation is often in terms of synthetic routes, the determination of structure, and relationships between chemical structure and a variety of biological effects. Nevertheless, the informa-

tion carried is very relevant to readers of the B.M.J. Almost all the writers are from major research laboratories in the pharmaceutical industry, and their contributions include much of the reasoning which has conditioned the spending of many millions of pounds on research in drug development.

It is important to note that these endeavours have a chemical or rather a chemotherapeutic logic, even though until their final stages they may lack a clinical rationale. The example of imipramine, recounted here by Häfliger and Burckhardt, is much to the point. This and related compounds were synthesized by loose analogy with phenothiazines. Pharmacologically imipramine was found suitably free from toxic effects and able to potentiate some

depressants, as was chlorpromazine. Clinical trial in mental illness was judged, however, to show imipramine's greatest value to be as an antidepressant. Pharmacological properties relevant to this action were subsequently noted—for example, antagonism to reserpine. Description of phenothiazines themselves is deferred to a second volume of the present series. This one includes groups of compounds related to reserpine, meprobamate, chlordiazepoxide, pipradrol, benactyzine, benzimidazoles, and monoamine oxidase inhibitors. A final chapter contributed by D. F. Downing describes psychotomimetic compounds. The book is admirably indexed.
