The book ends by a brief statement of the deficiencies, limits, and prospects of spleno-portography, and Leger rightly points out that splenic injection and direct injection into selected portal radicals are complementary methods and not opposed to each other.

This is an excellent book and should be readily available to anyone interested in the pathological anatomy of the portal tree.

Medical Emergencies

Compendium of Emergencies. 2nd edition. Edited by H. Gardiner-Hill, M.D., F.R.C.P. (Pp. 374 + xiii. 60s.) London: Butterworth. 1965.

Let me say at once, in view of minor criticisms which will follow, that this book is of such importance that no general practitioner, registrar, house-physician, or house-surgeon should be without it. It is written by a team of experts. Other experts in particular fields will find points to criticize. The delay in producing this review is due to my asking the opinion of several such before writing it. Very few criticisms

were forthcoming, and many were due to minor differences of opinion on which, in fields wherein I could claim no expertise, I found it impossible to judge between the writers and their critics.

I might perhaps enter a plea for the use of the ergometer in distinguishing between the paralysis of myasthenia gravis and that of overtreatment with cholinergic drugs. The use of angiography after recovery from strokes is mentioned but perhaps insufficiently stressed. Some criticism has been made of the immediate use of glucose in diabetic coma, but here I side with the authors of the chapter. I have used something very like their method for 30 years, and I remember being called a liar by a distinguished professor of medicine because I claimed that only 10% of my patients died. The authors go further and write, "Hyperglycaemic coma should never reach a fatal termination." I would like to see the intravenous use of hydrocortisone mentioned as an emergency method of treatment in Addisonian crisis.

The use of thyroid B.P. in myxoedema coma should go unmentioned in the next edition. The antithyroid drugs are useless in the treatment of thyroid crisis, their effects being too long delayed; and I would like to see

some mention of such things as "the lytic cocktail" of Laborit and Huguenard, a criticism of little practical importance in view of the extreme rarity of this emergency in these days. It is generally admitted that neostigmine is useless in thyrotoxic myopathy, and its mention might be omitted next time. In the section on agranulocytosis it is suggested that potassium perchlorate is safer than the thiouracils, but it is not mentioned that carbimazole is safer than either. The excellent chapter on the hazards of medical procedures should be expanded to give far more information about the unwanted effects of drugs, and the sound warnings about anticoagulant therapy might be still more strongly stressed. In the chapter on poisoning too little detail is sometimes given: "Mannitol diuresis is much easier to set up and use [than an artificial kidney] and is very effective," but this statement doesn't help much.

These are minor and controversial criticisms. There is one which is neither. It would be unkind to single out a chapter or chapters, but in some places the writing is so slovenly that one wonders how it was passed as fit for printing.
