

May 1964 under the patronage of the Campbell Soup Company. Its object, achieved with outstanding success, was to bring together some of the leading nutritionists and leading publicists of America, so that knowledge might be spread, and action taken, on the pressing problem of feeding the world's rapidly expanding population.

Each of the six sessions was opened by a brief introduction by a distinguished chairman, after which papers were given by a number of contributors (usually three) having allied interests. Another expert then acted as moderator for a panel discussion. Topics covered a wide range, and were not confined to the technicalities of nutrition. Thus R. R. Revelle gave a fascinating and well-illustrated account of irrigation schemes based on the damming of the Indus in Pakistan. P. M. Wagner, until recently editor of the *Baltimore Sun*, spoke on "Food as a Ritual," and recounted the conversation at a drinking party in ancient Greece at which Agathon entertained Plato. G. L. Mehren discussed

"Geography, Geopolitics, and World Nutrition," and pointed out that the daily intake of animal protein per head in the U.S.A. is ten times higher than in India or China.

The late Henry R. Luce, founder of the magazine *Time*, took up most of the opening session with a paper on "The Challenge of the Future, an Overview." The hungry masses of the world were contrasted with "a well-fed élite who have lost their way." He urged the need of a return of reverence to his country, and recalled the humble "grace before meals" in horse-and-buggy days. C. G. King, now President of the International Union of Nutrition Sciences, dealt with "Growth and Development," and stressed the great danger of malnutrition during the preschool period. Grace A. Goldsmith, in a paper on "Activity, Climate, and Food" reviewed requirements for various nutrients. In a contribution on "Food Lipids and Ageing Processes" A. L. Tappel raised hopes that the human life span may eventually be doubled, doubtless at the expense of

a still greater strain on world food supplies, by attention to the adequate provision of antioxidants in the diet.

A minor slip appears to occur on page 171, in Grace Goldsmith's excellent paper, where assessments of vitamin A requirements are given per head which would be about correct for per kg. body weight. Another contributor refers on page 228 to "tortilla" yeast being a component of the relief food Incaparina when "torula" yeast is probably meant. The name Sebrell is spelt in some places with an additional "e," which may at first give the impression that another person is involved. Apart from such trivialities the book can be warmly recommended. The inclusion of adequate author and subject indices will increase its usefulness as a work of reference. Its main value, however, will not be as a textbook but as a thought-provoking contribution towards the solving of a problem of vital importance for the future of mankind.
