The Midwife and the Witch

The Midwife and the Witch. By Thomas Rogers Forbes. (Pp. 196+x; illustrated. 48s.) London: Yale University Press. 1966.

Under this attractive title Dr. Thomas Forbes, who is professor of anatomy and associate dean of Yale University School of Medicine, has gathered together the fruits of researches which have spread over a number of years into medical folklore and superstitions, and especially those concerning reproduction and obstetrics. The result is a series of essays, attractively written and packed with informa-

tion, on such topics as hermaphroditism and sex reversal, pregnancy and fertility tests, sex prediction, the folklore of childbirth—with a separate chapter devoted to the caul ("the veil of good fortune")—on the midwife and the witch, and early English midwives.

While the popular journalist seeking out-of-the-way material for his Sunday supplements may welcome this as treasure trove, the scientific doctor of today might think it beneath his notice. He would be wrong to dismiss it, however. As the author writes in his preface, "We are all still believers; the difference lies in what we believe, and why." In a most valuable list of some 700 references it is salutary to note the number and status of the purely medical references from which Dr. Forbes has quoted the most bizarre ideas. Even this bibliography is not complete, for Dr. Forbes has collected his material mostly from the classics and from the British, French, and German literature.

Although the veils are now all but removed from the mystery of sex, the author empha-

sizes that for countless ages it has remained one of the most powerful and inexhaustible sources of magic and superstition. And when scientific "explanations" came to replace the folklore that was cherished by the credulous much of the explanation still remained speculation. We have had to wait for 1966 to see published an account of an "objective scientific study" of the most intimate personal experience in the life of any human being.¹ It will be interesting to see whether this work, reviewed at length in a monthly magazine for the general reader, gives rise to a new type of folklore, and whether Dr. Forbes will spot it quickly enough to incorporate it in the second edition of a book which will undoubtedly appeal to many kinds of reader.
