Treatment of Malaria

In the article by Professor W. Peters on "Treatment of Malaria" (10 April, p. 95), the second sentence of the second paragraph of "Individual Prophylaxis" should read "They thus provide good clinical protection by suppressing parasitaemia but do not act as causal prophylactics," and not "casual prophylactics." The sixth sentence of the same paragraph should read "Side effects of the 4-aminoquinolines are uncommon in adults" and not "of the aminoquinoline." In the second paragraph in the section on "Drug-resistant Falciparum Malaria" the reference to the potentiation of pyrimethamine and sulphadoxine should be no. 50 and not no. 51. The sixth sentence in this paragraph should read "Trimethoprim 500 mg+sulphalene 750 mg" and not phalene SLZ MW."
