the minimum number of staff on duty necessary to maintain essential services. Doctors who use the Post Office transfer service and require changes during the Christmas and New Year period should notify the telephone exchange before the holiday begins. If many changes will be required a letter detailing these should be sent to the supervisor at the local exchange by 18 December. The Post Office has asked that doctors do not request the exchange to switch their lines on Christmas Day (New Year's Day in Scotland). If this is unavoidable it would be helpful if switchings could be made operative before midnight on Christmas Eve and after 9 am on 26 December (31 December and 2 January in Scotland).

#### Chair of medical statistics, London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine

Mr M J R Healy has been appointed to the chair of medical statistics at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine from 1 March 1977. Mr Healy, who is 53, graduated from Cambridge. Until 1947 he served in the Admiralty as temporary experimental officer, and moved to Rothamsted Experimental Station as scientific and later senior principal scientific officer. Mr Healy became head of the computing and statistics division of the Medical Research Council's Clinical Research Centre at Northwick Park Hospital in 1965, and was visiting professor at Imperial College from 1965 to 1967.
