PAEDIATRIC NURSING

7-19 July 1985 in London

The purpose of this course, which is based at the Charles West School of Nursing, Hospitals for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street, London is to provide an up-to-date review of special areas of paediatric nursing and of the changing pattern of care.

The course will be under the direction of Miss B M Barchard, Chief Nursing Officer and Miss S Barlow, Director of Nurse Education. The course is open to senior nurses involved in the clinical, managerial and teaching aspects of paediatric nursing.

The Director of Studies will be **Dr H L Frankel**, Consultant in Spinal Injuries at the National Spinal Injuries Centre, Stoke Mandeville Hospital, Aylesbury and **Mr A G Hardy MBE**, formerly Consultant in charge of the Spinal Injuries Unit, Lodge Moor Hospital, Sheffield.

The course is intended primarily for physicians, surgeons and scientists involved in the management of spinal cord injuries.

The course will take place at the Postgraduate Centre, Stoke Mandeville Hospital and participants will be accommodated either in hospital accommodation at Stoke Mandeville itself or nearby.

The course is designed for experienced clinicians concerned with the management of infertility.

There are vacancies for 30 participants.

The course will take place at Bristol Maternity Hospital and Chelsea Hospital for Women. Participants will be accommodated at Rodney Lodge, University of Bristol and at a hotel in London.
