Death of the Calorie

Scientific journals are being advised to drop the word "calorie" and replace it with "energy" in phrases such as "energy requirements." This recommendation is based on the introduction of the joule as the unit of energy in nutritional sciences, and is the major change suggested in a report, Metric Units, Conversion Factors and Nomenclature in Nutritional and Food Sciences, published by the Subcommittee on Metrication of the British National Committee for Nutritional Sciences.
