

AAA, AAB, AAC, or ABB; and just over half scored 9-12 with AAD, ABC, BBB, AAE, ABD, ACC, BBC, ABE, ACD, BBD, BCC, ACE, ADD, BBE, BCD, or CCC.

The numbers of applicants for medical school places have risen steadily in the last few years, from 7500 in 1970 to 13 000 in 1974. The 1975 forecast, however, is for a fall to 12 000. (*U.C.C.A. G.M.C. Tests on Overseas Doctors

The Temporary Registration Assessment Board of the General Medical Council conducted its third test of "proficiency in the English language and of professional knowledge and competence" of overseas-qualified doctors in the first week of September. A total of 153 candidates were examined; 54 passed and 99 failed. The next test will be held in London in the week starting 22 September.
