Control of Population

Any change in the behaviour of millions of people against the weight of culture, tradition, and personal desire is sure to be according to the Population difficult. Council's Annual Report. It suggests that the best strategy should be to promote voluntary fertility control rather than either coercion (such as compulsory sterilization after the birth of a set number of children) or incentives and disincentives in the form of tax and welfare benefits. The council is to help in the setting up of national family planning programmes, the introduction of "population awareness" education programmes into the school system, and the support of scientific research to improve contraceptive technology.

Cardew-Stanning Foundation

Founded by the late Dr. Bruce Cardew, the Cardew-Stanning Foundation is a charitable trust whose object is to furnish greater support for research and development directed to fostering improved standards of medical care for the patients of general practitioners. The new foundation will continue much of the work of the General Practitioner Advisory Service and hopes particularly to underwrite or facilitate projects directed towards the development or improvement of management and organization in general practice. The initial annual income of the foundation is expected to be in the region of £10,000 and will be made available by the Lloyds Pharmaceutical Group. At present the foundation's address is 103 Mount Street, London W.1, but in the new year it will function from the Hospital Centre, Nutford Place, London W1H 6AN. Mr. Ellis Stanning is the chairman and Mr. J. M. Moore is the honorary secretary.
