looking for work at the end of that year. This compares with 5.4% in the previous year; there has been a steady rise since 1965, when unemployment was only 2.3%. Unemployment is higher among arts graduates than those with science degrees, but the trend is the same in all disciplines, according to a report by the University Grants Committee, First Employment of University Graduates, published by H.M.S.O. price 68p.

Voluntary Helpers

Ways in which members of the public can act as voluntary helpers in the field of mental handicap are given in a booklet, Yes You Can Help, published by the Health Department. The booklet is being issued to local and hospital authorities and to voluntary organizations.

Nurseries for Handicapped Children

The Spastics Society called last week for better nursery and educational facilities for handicapped children under 5 years old. The Secretary of State for Education should, said the society, cancel the circular (8/60) which at present prevents local education authorities from going ahead with nursery schools at their discretion.

Prize for X-ray Technique

The 1972 McRobert award of £25,000 has been won by Mr. Godfrey Hounsfield and E.M.I. Ltd. for the invention of a scanning technique for radiography of the brain. This technique avoids the use of injections of radio-opaque fluids but nevertheless gives clear resolution of soft tissues by a computerized transverse axial tomography. Since introduction of the system in April 1972 export orders worth £400,000 have been received from the U.S.A. alone.
