In the "Notes and Comments" section of "Any Questions?" (29 September, p. 690) we regret that Dr. Adrian Padfield's name was incorrectly spelt. The last sentence of Dr. Padfield's comment should have read "Another possible cause of cardiac arrest . . . 10 ml of 4% prilocaine, which is 40% less toxic than lignocaine but may produce cyanosis due to methaemoglobinemia."
