## OBITUARY.

We regret to have to announce the decease of the respected President of the Provincial Medical and Surgical Association, William Hey, Esq., of Leeds. We extract the following paragraph relative to this event from the "Leeds Intelligencer," of the 16th inst. :—

"THE LATE WM. HEY, ESQ.—The announcement of the death of this gentleman, in our obituary of this day, will be read with feelings of deep regret, and the event will be regarded as a great public loss. Few men have lived more truly beloved and respected, for his hand and heart were always prompt in every good work of utility, benevolence, or religion; and his unobtrusive virtues and sterling qualities of piety and kindness in private life, endeared him in the affections and esteem of all who knew him. As a member of the medical profession, in which the name of his family has long been distinguished and honored, Mr. Hey was one of its brightest ornaments. He was for many years senior surgeon of the Leeds General Infirmary, an institution closely linked with the memory of his venerated father. Mr. Hey was in his 73rd year at the time of his death, which took place on Wednesday last."
