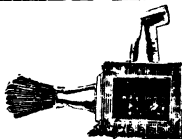

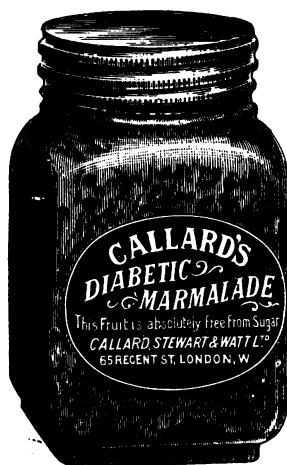

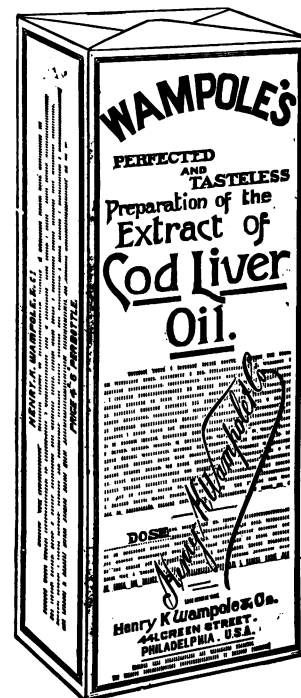

Now, it is said that certain manufacturers have adopted the idea of using this artificial oil for the production of salicylic acid; that is, they juggle with what remnants of conscience they may have, by taking artificial salicylic acid out of a compound into which they or somebody else has put it, and calling this "acid from the oil."

This circumstance will lead to confusion as to the real source of a given salicylic acid, and we regret to have to admit that there are probably some dealers who will resort to the subterfuge of supplying "acid from the oil," when they know that the oil is not the natural product. So where such acid is desired, the pharmacist must demand of his dealer a guarantee extending to the oil itself."

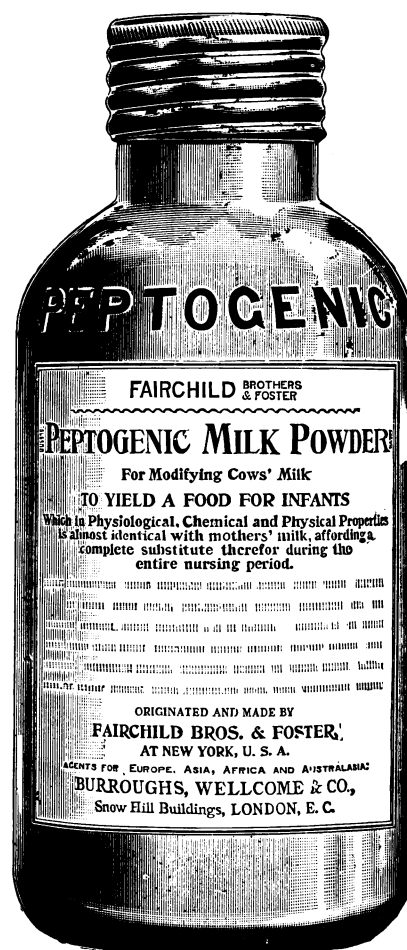
The Necessity of Modifying Caseine.

"The object to be accomplished in the preparation of cows' milk (for infants) is to make it resemble human milk as much as possible in chemical and physical properties. To do this, it is necessary to reduce the proportion of caseine, to increase the proportion of fat and sugar, and to overcome the tendency to coagulate into large firm masses upon entering the stomach."—STARR.

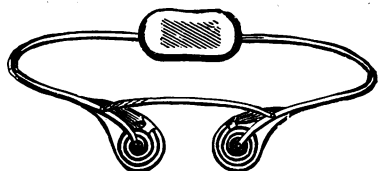
"With a view to improving on the red gum elastic tube that is almost universally used for vaginal douching I have devised one that is intended not only for simple hygienic self-douching, but which will be found to be of considerable advantage under all circumstances where it is necessary to apply antiseptic solutions to the walls of the vagina. The tube is seven inches long and rigid; its "business" end is bulbous, sufficiently so to allow facile introduction and withdrawal, yet of such size as will dilate each portion of the vagina as it is passed. It can be made of vulcanite or any rigid material that will bear the action of solutions. Those made for me by Messrs. Arnold & Sons are of vulcanite. The bulbs are of three sizes, the largest being used after parturition, or where the vagina is particularly roomy. This form of tube may be manipulated into each fornix freely and fearlessly, and however clumsy a patient or nurse may be, no harm can possibly be done to the parts. Rigidity enables the manipulator to douche out all folds, even if the size of the bulb is not of itself quite sufficient. The end is bulbous in order to dilate each successive portion of the vagina as it is passed, though it permits a ready outflow behind it, while complete collapse of the vaginal walls takes place upon the thin stem so that no air is admitted. The holes are made at the extreme end of the bulb and not on the periphery. The small end is made to fit on the ordinary bone rectal tube that accompanies all enema syringes."

CAUTION.—T. HAWKSLEY respectfully cautions the profession that many Haemacytometers are being sold which are a copy of the instrument made by him, BUT GROSSLY INEXACT in the depth of the cell and in the capacity of the millimetre pipettes. The former being frequently from 1/10ths to 1/15ths of a millimetre in excess of depth, and the latter from 2 to 25 cubic millimetres above or below the Standard quantity.

T. H. finds this caution necessary, as many such instruments have been sent to him for purpose of verification by his standards.

N.B.—An excess of 1/10th mm. in the depth of the cell alone produces an error of 5 per cent., whilst 1 cubic millimetre in the blood pipette develops an error of 20 per cent. in the observed reading.

FRACTURED PATELLA.—A WALKING splint for use after union of the upper and lower fragments. The steel joints at the sides are so made that the degree of bending at the knee joint can be gradually increased. In case of a slip the knee cannot bend more than is allowed by this adjustable stop, and thus prevents over-stretching of the newly-formed ligament. To assist extension of the limb a strong elastic band joins the upper and lower parts of the splint. This also is adjustable, and greatly assists the weakened quadriceps muscles in walking; as used at Guy's, the Middlesex, and St. Bartholomew's Hospitals. In the usual form, for twelve months' use, the splint is about 12 inches long, but for permanent disablement it is better to carry a light support to the heel of the boot.

By one or other of these methods almost any kidney may be so supported as to give its owner no trouble.

SPINAL STAYS.—FOR MEN AND Women.—(1) These stays are made of a specially strong material, though very porous, and have an abundant stiffening of whalebone, especially at the sides and back. They may be made nearly as rigid as poro-plastic jackets, and follow the treatment of the latter when something lighter and cooler may be used, but yet sufficiently supporting to complete the cure. For adults suffering from limp backs, but without any pronounced curvature or disease of the spine, they are invaluable, allowing nearly full movement of the body, and giving a feeling of springy support of which no other form of apparatus is capable. (2) In weakly children, growing fast, long-backed, and tall, the removing of some of the weight of the body above the hips, on to the hips, ensures the spine being kept straight during growth, and there is no intolerable restraint, heat, or other discomfort. In the early stages of lateral curvature, when the spine will straighten by slight extension, such stays are most useful, and if needed extra lateral supports are added to render them more rigid in prescribed directions. No form of spinal support will cure a deformed spine accompanied with appropriate muscular exercises and rest. These stays are of no use in any form of angular curvature of the spine or cervical vertebra.
