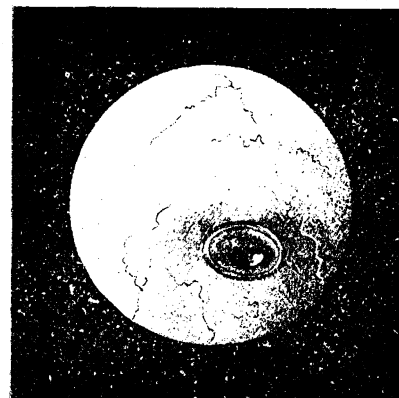

Experiments showing the Influence of Albulactin on the Curds of Cow's Milk.

"The dense, cohesive curd, formed by the casein of cow's milk during the process of digestion, has always proved a stumbling block in the artificial feeding of infants."

These words were written by a leading children's specialist in an article in "The Medical Magazine" for December, 1910. 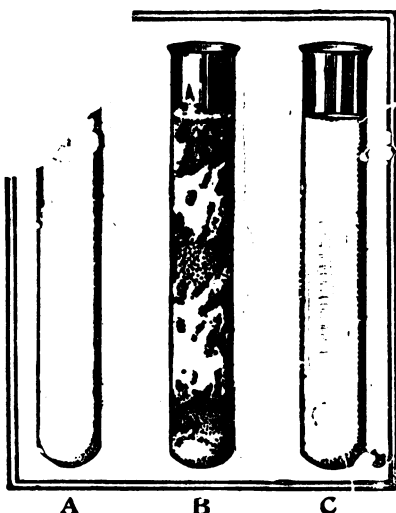

The President and Council will not consider themselves bound to award the Prize should any of the Essays not appear to them to possess sufficient merit.

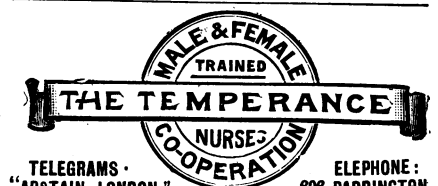

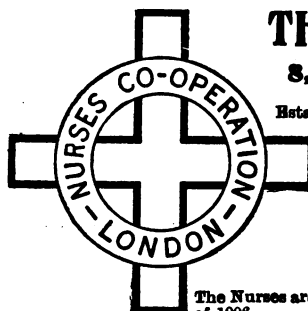
