

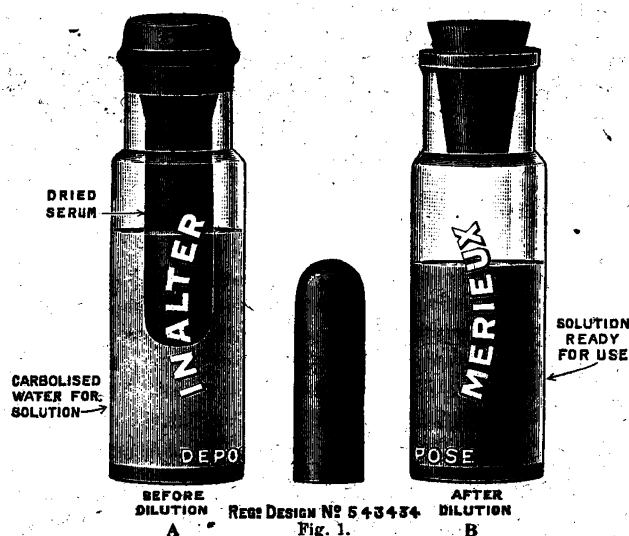

THE "INALTER" VIAL (Fig. 1) enables the doctor to have Serums ready to hand, and when required for use to quickly and easily prepare them—fresh and with full activity. The accompanying illustration shows the white glass vial A containing 9 c.c. of Carbolized Water, also a small U shaped actinic glass receptacle holding 1 gramme dried serum—these are both closed by a specially arranged rubber plug, the withdrawal of which allows the contents of the U shaped glass receptacle to be emptied into the Carbolized Water. The rubber plug is then replaced and the vial shaken—complete solution takes place rapidly, and the freshly prepared Serum is now ready for use as in B.

Antidiphtheritic Topical Application. Used by spray or brush for Coryza, or suspected condition of the throat.
