Recent research work (in particular that of Champy) showed that embryo tissue, when transplanted in plasma outside the organism, took on new growth. Embryonic connective tissue could be subcultured very many times since it grew so rapidly. Adult tissue when transplanted in vitro produced mitotic figures, and embryonic cells were split off. 
