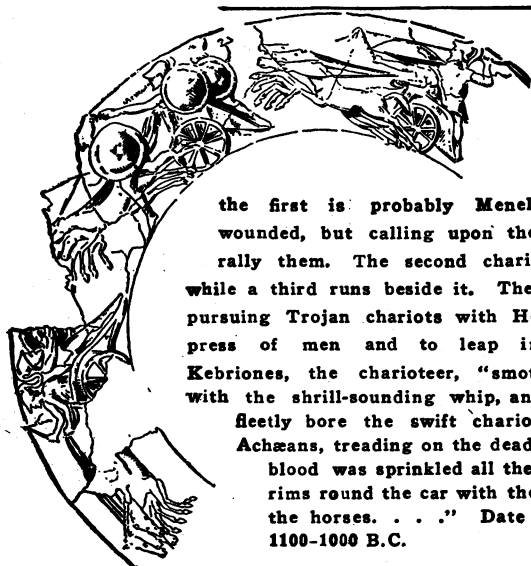

ROUT OF THE ACHÆANS;
 THE TROJANS IN PURSUIT.

—Three chariots are galloping at full speed towards the Achæan camp.

The bearded warrior in

the first is probably Menelaos driving away with wounded, but calling upon the Greeks, endeavouring to rally them. The second chariot contains two warriors, while a third runs beside it. Then follows the first of the pursuing Trojan chariots with Hector "eager to enter the press of men and to leap in and break through." Kebriones, the charioteer, "smote the fair-maned horses with the shrill-sounding whip, and they felt the lash and fleetly bore the swift chariot among the Trojans and Achæans, treading on the dead, and the shields, and with blood was sprinkled all the axle-tree beneath, and the rims round the car with the drops from the hooves of the horses. . . ." Date: Heroic Age of Greece, circa, 1100-1000 B.C.
