THIS unique dictionary contains 48,000 terms (German-English) pertaining to bacteriology; botany and zoology, including anatomy, embryology, pathology, physiology, entomology, genetics, chemistry, physics, and mathematics.

It is the first to combine fully the agricultural and biological terms with those of the physical sciences. Many common idioms are included, and past tenses and past participles are translated, making the dictionary unusually helpful either to advanced or elementary students.
