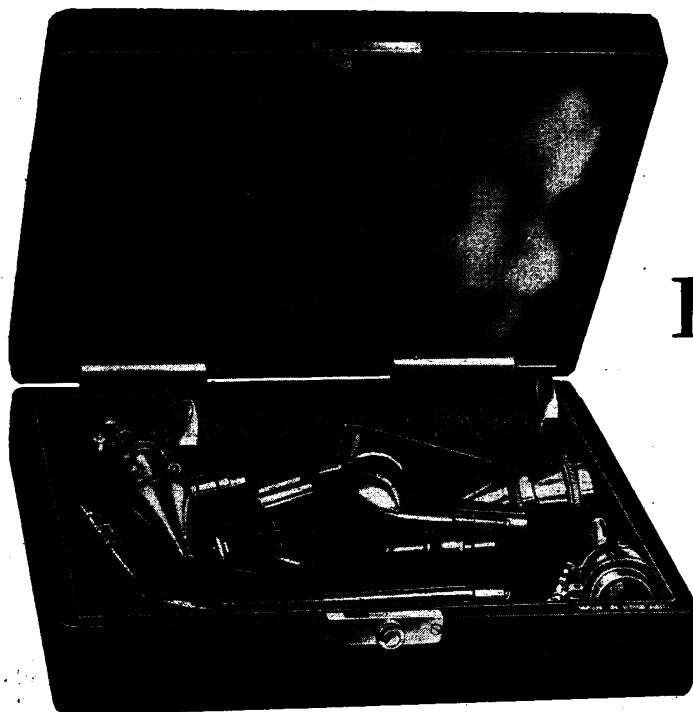

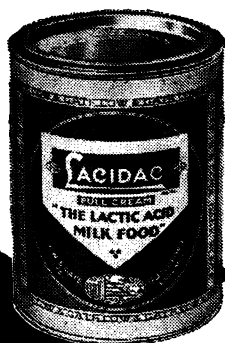

The Digestibility of Milk in Infant Feeding
