PREFACE TO THE SECOND EDITION

The first edition of this book was written in days of relative peace. Now that our men are engaged in the fighting services, and the homes of their families are bombed, casualty surgery is of such importance that I have rewritten the chapter on Open and Infected Fractures and War Wounds, and included recent developments in chemotherapy, blood and plasma transfusion, the treatment of wound shock, the closed plaster technique, and the technique of amputation. Other improvements which have been incorporated were suggested by friends and reviewers for whose uniform enthusiasm I am grateful. The rate of disposal of a large first edition was so unexpected that within the first year of publication the book has been out of print for several months, and for this I apologise.
