In five cases solutions of 0.1 per cent. proflavine sulphate at pH 6.3 (made from Boots Isoflav tablets) were used freely as irrigating lotions to the exposed brain and skull wounds after débridement had been carried out and before the wounds were closed by primary suture. In another case of small penetrating shot-gun wounds where débridement was technically impossible the various puncture wounds were treated by a single irrigation with proflavine solution. Only one out of the six patients died, the remainder, including the case of shot-gun wounds, healing by first intention without any signs of wound infection or oedema of the brain. The one death occurred after operation from shock due to multiple injuries to other parts of the body; histological examination of the brain showed no damage in excess of the trauma inflicted.
