


Scanning Electron Microscopic photographs of Candida albicans before and after treatment with miconazole



1. Untreated cells appear as isolated yeast forms in an oval shape and with a smooth surface showing the formation of polar buds (pb).



2. Upon exposure to a fungistatic dose  $(10^{-7}\mathrm{M})$  of miconazole the cells tend to cluster. Budding becomes disorganized with visible budding scars (bs) that are randomly distributed over the surface of



3. Treatment with a fungicidal dose of miconazole causes the cell wall (cw) to burst. Vesicles of cytoplasm disintegrate and adhere to the surface of yet unbroken cells (cpr). (The interior of the cells is completely lytic).





Burinex (burnetanide) is a potent short-acting diuretic indicated in the treatment of oedema. Available as Burinex Tablets (1mg and 5 mg), Burinex Injection (4 ml and 25 ml ampoules; each ml contains 0.25 mg bumetanide) and Burinex K (0.5 mg bumetanide and 7.7 mmol slow release KCI). Dosage: oral and parenteral normally 1 mg. Higher doses may be used in resistant oedema, for long-term maintenance therapy of CCF, Burinex K is usually given as 2 tablets O.M. Contra-indications: Hepatic coma and severe electrolyte disturbances. Burinex K should not be used with potassium sparing agents. Adverse reactions: Occasional skin rashes and minor gastric upset. Precautions: Burinex may potentiate antihypertensive therapy and rarely, may affect carbohydrate metabolism. Periodic electrolyte checks are advisable on long-term therapy. Burinex K should be stopped immediately if signs or symptoms of bowel ulceration appear.
