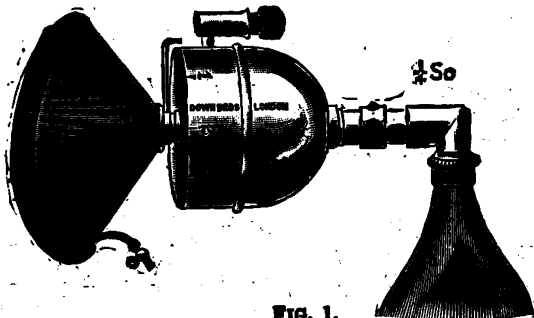

Shows the Tube inserted between the inhaler and the bag for use in combination with ether.

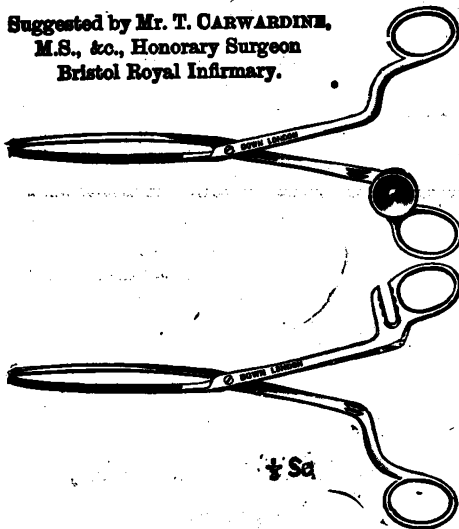


FIG. 2.

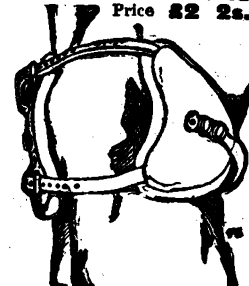

A splendid achievement in the French "Regularity Trials."

"Of all the competitions organised by the Automobile Club of France, none is more valuable than its 'regularity trials.' This year's fixture resulted in the demonstration of the endurance possessed by several cars on a long run, over every condition of surface, under genuine touring conditions.

The wintry weather and bad going have failed to affect in any way the performance of the De Dion cars. The new 30-h.p. and the modest 8-h.p. models were those selected for the contest, two of the larger types being run—a double phaeton and a limousine.

All three of the cars finished the run—totalling in its eight stages 2,500 kilometres—without a single penalty mark. Though somewhat of an achievement for the new 'thirties,' this must be admitted a still finer performance for the little 8-h.p. model. She has the ordinary 100 x 120 single cylinder engine, and Vignion, her driver, is found to have exceeded an average of 35 kilometres per hour.

Such a result will be gratifying to the many adherents of the De Dion in this country."

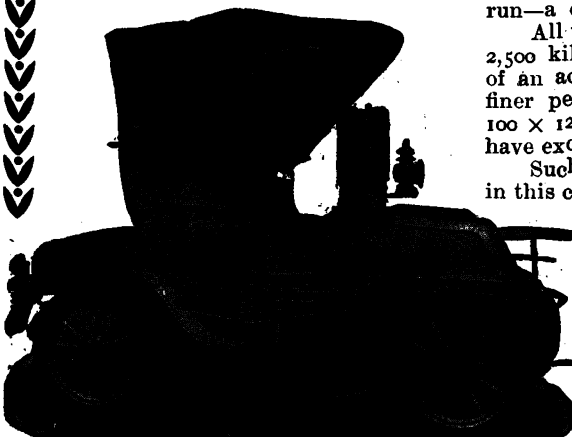
