VALMY, A.D. 1792, has been described as the "primal victory of revolutionary France." The veteran and finely disciplined armies of Austria and Germany, augmented by 15,000 "émigrés" composed of the flower of the old French nobility, had set forth to invade France and crush the Revolution. This inspired the "Marseillaise," and its cry "To arms" spread with amazing force from the heart of France through all her provinces.

It had been declared that the revolutionary volunteers, consisting of artisans and tradesmen, mechanics and peasants, would disband at the first shot, but, after a baptism of fire lasting a whole day, they stood their ground and forced the invaders to retreat. Goethe, who was present at the battle as a spectator, remarked at the close, "from this place and from this day commences a new era in the world's history."

The portraits reproduced are those of Kellermann and Dumouriez, the leaders of the French revolutionists, and of the Duke of Brunswick who commanded the allied armies.
