

Should one Buy Books or Borrow Them?

THE experience of every reader is that some books are to him worth buying and keeping, while others are well worth reading but not in his case worth buying. It is therefore good policy to borrow books first and to buy only those that, after perusal, are found to have a permanent interest.

The best book-lending service in the world is that offered by The Times Book Club, and known as its "Guaranteed Service." The rate is 6 guineas per annum for three volumes at a time. This insures the supply immediately on publication of practically all the best books. With the few exceptions mentioned in the prospectus books not on the Library shelves are specially bought from the publishers, if neces ary, for the subscriber, who is thus certain of getting without waiting the best books of the day. The rates and conditions of subscription will be found in the prospectus.

There is a cheaper subscription of £3 3 0 per annum for three volumes at a time, which, though a less perfect service, is quite satisfactory to those who read mainly for amusement or relaxation and are willing to wait their turn for the newest books.

Annual, half-yearly, and even quarterly subscriptions, for one, two or three volumes are taken and afford an easy test of the Library.
