Wilder's Clinical Diabetes Mellitus & Hyperinsulinism

In this entirely new book Dr. Russell M. Wilder gives in detail those methods and treatments he has used with success at the Mayo Clinic. Guidance is given in the kind of insulin to use, in timing and adjusting doses, in dealing with complications, etc. He indicates what type of diet to select for both the adult and the child patient, advises on questions of exercise, on the use of therapeutic agents other than insulin, on Vitamin B complex, etc. Fully half of the book is devoted to the complications of diabetes, with special regard for the treatment of acidosis and coma. Four chapters cover the diagnosis, pathology, symptomatology, course, and treatment of Hyperinsulinism, and an appendix is included giving weights and measurements, equivalents, household measures, tables of food values, standard diets for adults and children, etc.

Buckstein's Roentgenology of Alimentary Tract

This book was written to meet the needs of the general physician in reading and interpreting X-ray films in terms of clinical diagnosis. In every one of the 525 original X-ray plates the whites of the actual films are shown white in the X-ray pictures; and the blacks of the films are shown black. They are "negative" reproductions—not "positives"—just like the X-ray plates themselves. Important essentials are given in detail, such as turning the patient through all angles of obliquity; the "spot film" device, using the fluoroscope and X-ray at the same time; the "double-contrast" method of barium and air injections, etc. Normal as well as pathological findings are given, and the underlying aetiology and pathology of the various lesions are described in order to permit a clearer and more accurate understanding of the changes shown in the roentgenograms. This is a work of outstanding authority.

Levine's Clinical Heart Disease

In its first edition Dr. Levine's book established itself firmly as a sane and sound guide to the treatment and management of diseases of the heart. For this new (second) edition the author has given it a careful and exacting revision, and has enlarged it by 50 pages. A new chapter on the Medicolegal Aspects of Heart Disease has been added. From his own wide experience as a cardiologist, Dr. Levine tells how to examine the patient, what to look for and what it means. He stresses differential diagnosis because of its special importance, and includes a chapter of 128 pages on Electrocardiography, which contains 533 electro-cardiograms on 107 figures. The book is particularly strong on treatment—general care, dietary regulations, use of drugs, relief of pain, surgical procedures, etc., are all covered from the viewpoint of what to do, when, and how to do it.

Walters & Snell's Diseases of Gallbladder & Bile Ducts

This new book records the clinical experience of Drs. Walters and Snell and their associates at the Mayo Clinic. Particular attention has been given to direct and differential diagnosis, including an entire chapter on the technique of Cholecystography and the interpretation of the findings. It is for treatment, however, more than for any other feature, that this book will be valued and used. Here, in comprehensive detail, are the self-same methods, both operative and non-operative, that the distinguished authors have found successful in actual practice at the Mayo Clinic. You are told just what treatment each disorder calls for and exactly when and how to institute it. You are advised on diet, drugs, indication for operations, anaesthesia, dangers and precautions, step-by-step surgical technique. There are five chapters alone on Preoperative and Postoperative Care, including oxygen therapy and the use of Vitamin K and bile salts in haemorrhagic diathesis.
