





# B.D.H. COMMON COLD VACCINES

The most effective means of reducing the incidence of the common cold and of mitigating the sequelæ of secondary bacterial infection is still by the use of a suitable catarrhal vaccine.

The usual method is to give a series of four injections (0.25 c.c., 0.5 c.c., 1 c.c. and 1 c.c.) with an interval of seven to ten days between each. For preference, the course should be started in September and the resulting immunity maintained by giving a further 1 c.c. every month throughout the autumn and winter.

Alternatively, the immunity may be maintained, after giving four injections, by giving at least one B.D.H. Common Cold Vaccine Tablet orally each week, increasing the dose to one tablet daily during periods of particular liability to infection and during epidemics.



# Safer Pregnancy and Puerperium

Investigations carried out in London<sup>1</sup>, involving a study of the records of over 5,000 pregnant women, showed that there was a dietary deficiency of Vitamins A, B<sub>1</sub> and C in about 50 per cent. of cases, of calcium in 70 per cent., and of iron in 98 per cent.

After the provision of supplements containing adequate amounts of Vitamins A, B complex, C and D, with calcium, iron, iodine, manganese and copper, the following significant results were noted:—

Among 1,530 primigravidae the toxæmia rate was 27.1 per cent. as compared with the rate of 31.7 per cent. in a control group of 1,512 primigravidae not receiving

Based on an annual birthrate of 600,000, this represents a possible reduction of 10,000 cases of toxemia per annum by the use of a pre-natal diet adequate in vitamins and mineral elements. Noteworthy, too, was the effect on the new-born infant as shown by a definite reduction in the number of premature births.

Similar results obtained by investigations at the Toronto General Hospital<sup>2</sup> showed that a good, or supplemented, pre-natal diet resulted in better health for the mother, a lower incidence of toxemias, miscarriages, premature births, or still births, with a decrease in the morbidity and mortality of the infant during the early months of life.







# 'ROCHE' News in Brief

### Menstrual Delay and Pregnancy Test

Fifty-seven cases of menstrual delay were treated by injection of 1 mg. (2 ampoules) 'Prostigmin' on 3 consecutive days after endocrine disorders had been ruled out. If menstrual flow was not established within 72 hours a tentative diagnosis of pregnancy was made until confirmed by the Friedman test or clinical observation. A normal menstrual flow was produced in all those who were not pregnant, and those whom pregnancy was subsequently confirmed successfully continued their pregnancies. The number of injections required to induce menstruation varied, some needing 3, some 2 and others only 1; occasionally 4 were required .- Journ. Amer. Med. Assoc., May 8, 1943, 122, p. 81.

### Removal of X-ray Intoxication Symptoms

The intramuscular injection of an ampoule of 'Benerva' Forte (25 mg.) daily proved very beneficial in combating vomiting and other forms of X-ray intoxication. Of 35 patients with marked X-ray intoxication symptoms 15 responded very well, so that a complete remission was obtained. In 12 cases, 7 of them severe cases, an appreciable improvement was found. In 8 cases no effect could be found, three of these being regarded as failures. Sometimes one to two injections were sufficient to abolish completely the symptoms.—Radiologia Clinica, 1942, 11, p. 349.

# Treatment of Epistaxis with Vitamin C

'Redoxon' (vitamin C) has proved of value in 16 cases for the treatment of severe nose-bleeding, which could not be stopped by any of the other methods tried. One gram (2 ampoules of 'Redoxon' forte) was injected intravenously, and if the bleeding did not stop within a few minutes the injection was repeated either with the same dose or, if it was abating, with 0.5 gm.-La Semana Medica, 1942, p. 312.

### Encouraging Results of Vitamin E Therapy

Successful results were obtained with the use of vitamin E therapy in 5 patients, 3 of whom were suffering from peripheral neuritis, with the Guillain-Barre syndrome, one from amyotonia congenita, and one from either amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or muscular dystrophy of the Aran-Duchenne type. The dosage used was 10 mg. of 'Ephynal' 3 times a day for varying periods, being increased in one case to 75 mg. a day. In all a striking increase in muscular strength and tone occurred. According to the author "further clinical trial of synthetic vitamin E in neuromuscular affections is warranted."-J. Nerv. & Ment. Dis., 1942, 96, p. 184.

# **Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis**

An advanced case of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis showed marked improvement on treatment with 'Ephynal.' (Dose: 50 mg. 3 times a day for 5 months, after which the dose was reduced to 25 mg. 3 times a day, and treatment was continued with 25 mg. 3 times a day). The patient was able to climb stairs, whereas previously he had been unable to walk at all and had been either confined to bed or to a wheel chair. This improvement was being maintained.-Medical Times, 1942, 70, p. 247.






