**Sharpey Memorial.** — It has been resolved by a number of the Pupils and Friends of PROFESSOR SHARPEY to establish a "Sharpey-Physiological Laboratory and Scholarship" in University College, as a permanent Memorial of the value of his labours as a Physiologist and a Teacher.
