THE DISTILLERS COMPANY LIMITED

The 85th Annual General Meeting of The Distillers Company Limited will be held in the North British Hotel, Edinburgh, on Friday, September 14, 1962, at 12.15 p.m. The following are excerpts from the Statement by the Chairman, Sir Graham Hayman, which has been circulated with the Report and Accounts for the year ended March 31, 1962.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS ON TRADING

The year under review was a very active one and turnover for the Group amounted to £267m.—a slight increase over the previous year although in the main the volume was appreciably higher.

Our Scotch Whisky and Gin Companies earned a moderate increase in profits and their proportion of the Group total is at present 88%.

Our industrial activities had a sharp set-back in earnings due to the generally unsettled state of trade which has adversely affected the Chemical and Plastics industries in the United Kingdom.

Referring now to the Accounts, the trading profit of the year after depreciation was £30,625,818 compared with £31,901,589 in the previous year, a reduction of £1,275,771. We have consolidated for the first time the results of the British Xylonite Group, which was acquired towards the end of the previous financial year. This Group shared in the set-back referred to above and consequently made a smaller contribution to our profits than had been hoped.

Income from trade investments was higher at £2,744,146 (£2,556,571) and interest on loans somewhat lower at £573,055 (£590,432), so that the Group profit before elimination of outside interests was £32,796,909 (£33,867,728). The profit before taxation attributable to The Distillers Company itself was £519,494 less than last year at £32,971,112 (£33,490,606). At the higher rate imposed by the Finance Act of 1961, taxation required £16,476,573, making the net profit attributable to the Company £16,494,539 compared with £17,224,224 last year.

During the year under review, the Company obtained additional capital by way of a rights issue in the proportion of one new ordinary share for every ten held. The expenses of the issue have been written off.

Your Directors have appropriated £4,000,000 to general reserve and recommended that a final dividend be declared on the Ordinary capital at the rate of 7½% which, with the interim of 6%, makes 13½% for the year, the same rate as last year but of course on the capital as increased by the recent issue.

In the Consolidated Balance Sheet, you will observe that almost £10,000,000 has been expended upon additional buildings and plant.

Our stocks of Scotch Whisky again rose substantially, broadly accounting for the increase in the stock figure shown in the Balance Sheet.

On the liabilities side of the Consolidated Balance Sheet, the capital is increased by the rights issue to which I have already referred and by the small additional issue required to complete the acquisition of The British Xylonite Company Limited. The premiums involved in these issues totalled £22,123,765 and account for the major portion of the increase in capital reserves.

SCOTCH WHISKY

Our Malt and Grain Distilleries had a successful season and the output and quality of our new whiskies have never been higher.

The new blending and bottling plant and offices of John Dewar & Sons Limited, near Perth, were completed early this year and, on June 15 last, we were privileged to have The Rt. Hon. Lord Polwarth, T.D., Chairman of The Scottish Council (Development and Industry), perform the official opening ceremony.

Stocks of Scotch Whisky held by the Industry have again increased and, at March 31, 1962, stood at 327.2 million proof gallons. This compares with 296.9 million proof gallons at the same date in 1961.

Home Trade figures have undoubtedly been adversely affected by the 10% surcharge imposed by the Chancellor in July, 1961, and subsequently consolidated as part of the Budget proposals in April, 1962.

The consolidation of the surcharge came as a most unwelcome surprise to the Industry, particularly as both the Prime Minister and the Chancellor had been good enough to state that a good case had been made by the Scotch Whisky Industry for a reduction in duty. One might therefore expect that an industry which for so many years has made, and still continues to make, so great a contribution to Britain's balance of payments, should not be given such inequitable treatment by H.M. Government.

The British duty has been raised no less than seven times since 1939 and to-day the Chancellor is taking 27s. 1d. on a bottle of Scotch Whisky priced to the consumer at 41s. 6d.

So far as our home sales are concerned, until the full effect of the surcharge became apparent in the early months of 1962, we had a reasonable expectation of a substantial increase. In the event, our Home Trade sales were almost identical with those of last year.

Expansion has taken place in export shipments by the Industry and I am glad to say that our own export sales showed a satisfactory increase.

The United States continued to take increased supplies. Although we shared in this additional demand, our proportion of the increase was less than that secured by the rest of the Industry, which may be attributed to two factors: first, the continued exports of Scotch Whisky in bulk for bottling in the U.S.A., in which for policy reasons we are not participating, and second, the continued growth of competition from other brands.

These are conditions which must be expected, and met, in an expanding and competitive market but they must also be viewed against the solid progress of our own brands and the eminent position which they hold throughout the world.

Australia continues to be an excellent market and our business there gives us every cause for satisfaction.

In New Zealand, import control is still in operation but I am glad to say that we are obtaining a substantial share of the business which is available.

So far as Canada is concerned, the Scotch Whisky Industry as a whole is apparently doing little more than maintaining its sales. The recent emergency increase in tariffs of 15% must inevitably add to the handicaps on our selling efforts in this market.

In Venezuela, following upon the reduction in duties to which I referred last year, there has been a marked improvement but in present circumstances it is difficult to envisage Scotch Whisky sales in this market reaching the high level achieved prior to the increase in duty towards the end of 1959.

During the year under review, the Common Market countries have again taken greatly increased supplies, the overall growth being approximately 24% over the Industry's shipments during the previous year.

We are now in a position where we are just about able to supply all demands both at home and abroad, with the exception of our de luxe brands which are still in short supply. There are good reasons for believing that Scotch Whisky exports will continue to grow year by year. This applies particularly to industrialized countries where the standard of living is rising and also where trading can be carried on under reasonably normal conditions.

GIN

So far as the home market is concerned, the impact of the 10% surcharge applied with equal force to Gin as to Scotch Whisky, with the result that our Home Trade sales showed a slight decline as compared with the previous year.

With regard to the overseas markets, we are continuing the policy to which I have previously referred, namely, the production of one or more of our brands of Gin in those areas where the changing economic conditions and competition from local manufacture—often enjoying a preferential rate of duty—make this desirable.

The continued increase of manufacture overseas is naturally affecting our exports from this country and, in the year under review, these showed a slight decline from the previous year. On the other hand, however, this decline was more than offset by increased sales of Gin manufactured overseas.

INDUSTRIAL GROUP

The competitive factors to which I referred last year, together with the recession in the demand for consumer goods, led to unsettled conditions in the heavy organic chemicals and plastics fields in which the major part of our industrial activities lies.

The volume of our sales has been well maintained and in certain cases increases have been achieved. The overall position of the British market, however, has not given evidence of any significant growth and selling prices have come under considerable pressure. These abnormal conditions have made the year a difficult one and brought about a sharp contraction in profits.

It is our view that on balance the British chemical and allied industries will benefit from our entry into the Common Market. There may well be additional competition in some sections but, on the other hand, it would appear that fair trading conditions should be more readily established within the European community.

CHEMICAL DIVISION. Sales of our general chemicals held up very well, with the exception of calcium carbide.

Carbon dioxide sales have continued to rise and the fields of application are also expanding. Some additions have been made to our available production capacity and, as the present trend of sales seems likely to continue, it has been decided to establish a large new production unit.

Our new plant for producing acetic acid has been completed and is now in operation.

BRITISH HYDROCARBON CHEMICALS LIMITED. British Hydrocarbon Chemicals continued to make progress and production of many chemicals, including such basic products as ethylene and phenol, reached new records. During the year, a large methanol plant was successfully commissioned and I am glad to say that we have been able to sell almost its entire output in home and export markets. The plant for producing Rigidex high density polyethylene is now working to capacity, but present market prices are low.

Substantial progress is being made with the construction of the large petroleum chemicals plant at Baglan Bay, in South Wales, which is expected to start up in the first half of next year.

PLASTICS GROUP. Our Plastics Group has once again increased its output and sales of plastics materials during the year. Owing, however, to markedly lower selling prices, and despite efforts to reduce production costs, trading results were unsatisfactory.

The long-term trend of consumption continues to rise and, despite the present situation, further expansion in production is under consideration in order to take advantage of the new outlets constantly being found for plastics, and to reduce production costs.

BIOCHEMICAL DIVISION. Conditions in the pharmaceutical industry at home and overseas remained highly competitive. Export prices of basic antibiotics such as penicillin and streptomycin were under pressure and margins contracted, although operating efficiencies improved and the volume of sales increased.

The Division withdrew its Thalidomide products from the market; immediately following receipt of the first report from abroad suggesting the association of this drug with certain cases of congenital abnormality. The drug had been subjected to thorough testing in accordance with all recognized procedures, and was highly regarded by the medical profession as being of exceptional value in the treatment of certain conditions.

The utmost sympathy must go to the parents and children who have suffered tragedies which may be associated with this drug.

FOOD DIVISION. Total production constituted a record. Additional capacity came into operation during the year and further expansion is now being installed.

TECHNICAL DEVELOPMENT

Our scientific and engineering staffs have been fully occupied on a wide variety of projects ranging from exploratory research to the erection of a number of manufacturing plants. The challenge which British industry faces to-day gives still greater emphasis to the necessity for maintaining these services at the highest level of efficiency.

PERSONNEL

I should like to record the thanks of the Directors to all ranks of employees for their sustained efforts during a difficult year.

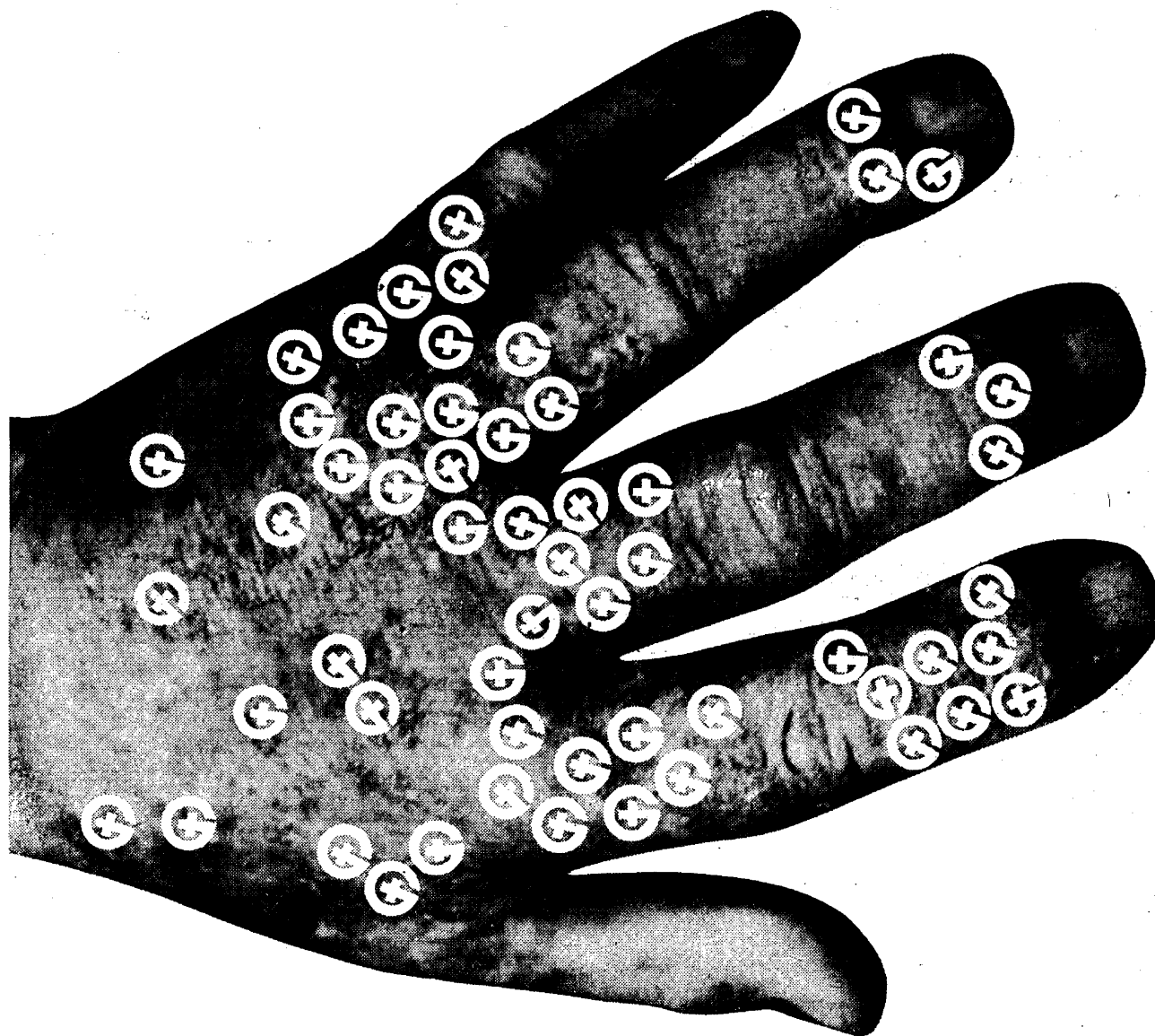
FUTURE PROSPECTS
