



A MEDICAL TUTOR has been appointed, for the express purpose of assisting he Students in the practical portion of their studies.

Special instruction is provided in Ophthalmic, Aural, and Dental Surgery, Comparative Anatomy, Histology, and Pathological Anatomy. The CLINICAL SYSTEM is so organised that the training of every individual student is supervised; there are also departments for the Diseases of Women and Children, of the Eye and Ear, of the Skin, and of the Throat.

SCHOLARSHIPS, PRIZES, AND APPOINTMENTS.

A SCHOLARSHIP of £40 for three years, and an EXHIBITION of £30, are awarded every year by open competition in Natural Science previous to entrance at the School; and two Scholarships of £20 each to Students of the second and third years respectively, with Prizes in each class, are awarded annually.

All the Resident Medical appointments (including the House-Surgeoncies) are open to the pupils without expense of any kind, and are equivalent to five Scholarships of the annual value of \$50. 


