We compared cimetidine with conventional medical treatment. Carbenoxolene was chosen for patients under 60, but because of its potential side effects – namely, hypokalemia, fluid retention and hypertension – older patients were given Caved-(S).

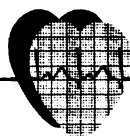
