SELEXID Prescribing Information Available as Selexid tablets and Suspension. Each tablet contains 200mg pivmecillinam hydrochloride; each unit-dose foil sachet of suspension contains 100mg pivmecillinam as white granules to be dissolved in a small quantity of water. Tablets and suspension should be taken with a meal. **Dose for Urinary Tract Infections:** Tablets and suspension: From 200mg 8 hourly - 400mg 6 hourly depending on severity. For children weighing less than 40kg: 20-40mg/kg bodyweight daily in 3-4 divided doses. **Contra-indications:** Penicillin or cephalosporin hypersensitivity. **Precautions/Adverse Reactions:** In accordance with normal practice Selexid should be avoided in the 1st trimester of pregnancy.
