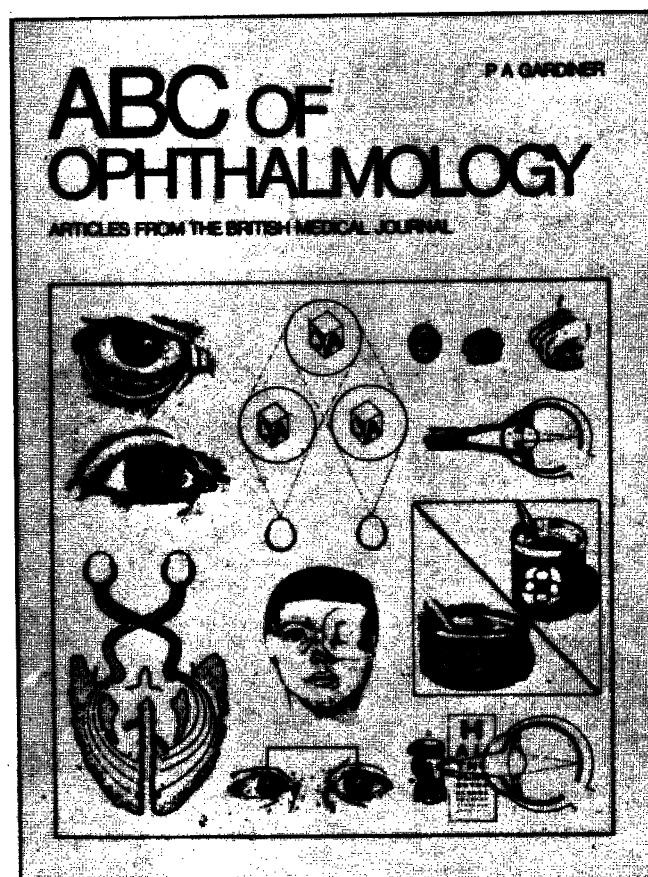

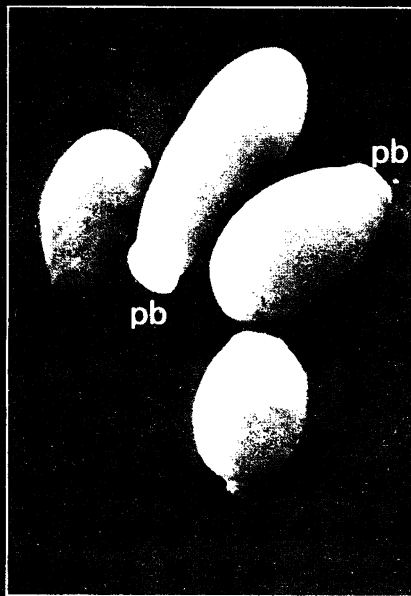

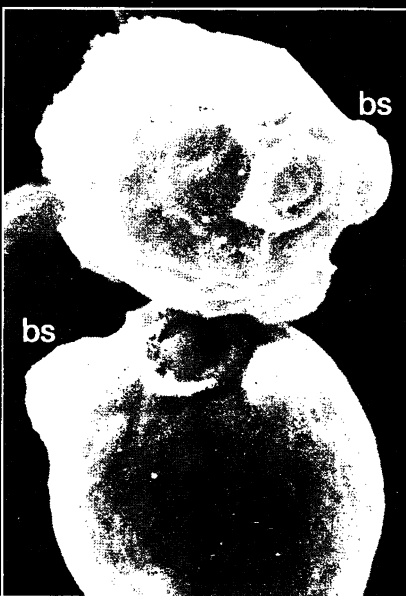

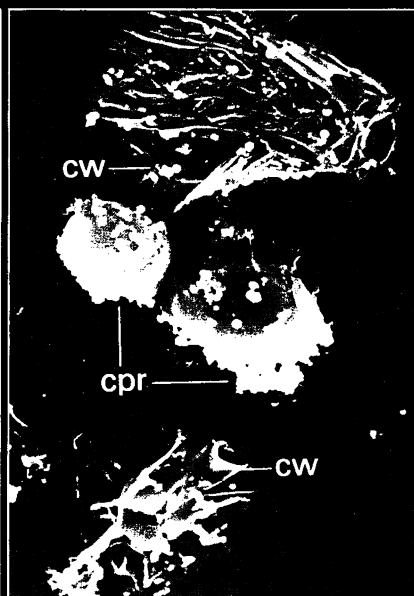
Scanning Electron Microscopic photographs of *Candida albicans* before and after treatment with miconazole.
