Presentation Tablets of 25 and 50mg diclofenac sodium; suppositories of 100mg diclofenac sodium. Indications Rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis, low back pain, ankylosing spondylitis Dosage Tablets: 75-150mg daily in two or three divided doses. Suppositories: one daily, usually administered at night. In more severe cases, combined therapy with tablets is recommended (daily dose should not exceed 150mg). Contra-indications Peptic ulceration; patients in whom attacks of asthma, urticaria or acute rhinitis are precipitated by asprin or other NSAIs. Precautions Do not prescribe during pregnancy unless there are compelling reasons. Patients with a history of peptic ulcer, haematemesis or melaena, or with severe hepatic or renal insufficiency, should be kept under close surveillance. Voltarol has been reported to depress solicylate levels and vice versa; the clinical relevance of this is not yet clear. Use suppositories only with caution in patients with painful or irritable ano-rectal conditions. Side-effects Transient epigastric pain, nausea and diarrhoea, headache and slight dizziness have been reported, as occasionally have skin rash, peripheral oederna and abnormalities of serum transaminases and (very rarely) peptic ulcer and haematemesis or melaena. Local reactions to suppositories include itching, burning and increased frequency of bowel movement.
