Statistics for editors of medical journals

5/6 November 1982

A meeting on statistics for editors of medical journals, aimed at helping them to assess the statistical aspects of papers they receive for publication, will be held at the Royal Station Hotel, Station Road, York YO2 2AA from 1630 on 5 November to 1600 on 6 November.

The meeting will take the form of a series of seminars, conducted by Mr Douglas Altman (Medical Statistician, MRC Clinical Research Centre), which will provide an elementary grounding in statistics for non-statistician editors to help them assess papers and to make the best use of their statistical referees. Numbers will be limited.

The fee of £70 (£65 for members of the BMA or ELSE) includes a single room and all meals. A special rate of £130 (£125 for members of BMA or ELSE) is available for editors attending both the statistics conference and the editing conference on 4/5 November. 
