Study of the organ's and recipient's ability to withstand the operation, methods of preservation, the pattern of rejection and immunosuppression have all been the subject of experimental work which is reviewed here. Considerable space is devoted to the operation itself, its timing, the selection of a suitable donor, the donor operation, anaesthesia and monitoring, the instruments required and the post-operative care. Prevention of rejection by immunosuppressive drugs is also described, and the possibilities of recurrence of the patient's original disease in the transplant are explored.
