Not Always on the Level, by E J Moran Campbell, professor of medicine at McMaster University, is a rich, romantic, and at times sadly moving collection of reminiscences, describing life as a child in Yorkshire, a student in London, a struggling clinical scientist both in Britain and the United States, as a medical educator in Canada . . . and as a manic depressive. 

Books for the collector

Limited editions of medical classics published under an imprint named after Sir Geoffrey Keynes

Sir Geoffrey Keynes, who died in July 1982 at the age of 95, was one of the great polymaths. His twin loves were medicine and surgery, on the one hand, and literature and the arts, on the other and he pursued both with equal success. He worked closely with the Nonesuch Press, editing several of its books, and it is therefore fitting that the Keynes Press should be named after him. Aimed primarily at reprinting classics with a medical interest published in the period of Keynes' life, the press pursues the same standards of scholarship and elegance that characterised the Nonesuch Press. Each book is specially edited and designed, and contains a commissioned introduction by an expert.

The Great Malaria Problem and its Solution by Ronald Ross. Introduction by LJ Bruce-Chwatt, emeritus professor of tropical public health at the University of London. Adapted from Ross's memoirs, this Keynes Press edition gives the full story of his discovery of the mode of transmission of malaria by the Anopheles mosquito. Engagingly written it provides a fascinating insight into the process of scientific research as well as a self portrait of one of the most impressive and colourful individuals in the history of tropical medicine. "Anybody, young or old, who relishes an adventure story, a potpourri of physical hardship, personal grit and determination, and painstaking detection, will find it impossible to put the book aside until he has read it from cover to cover." The Fatal Illness of Frederick the Noble by Morrell Mackenzie. Introduction by Harold Ludman, consultant, ear, nose, and throat surgeon, King's College Hospital, and Jonathan Steinberg, fellow of Trinity Hall, Cambridge. Mackenzie's account of his part in the treatment of Crown Prince Frederick of Prussia for a tumour of the larynx, a case that, besides arousing violent disagreement about acceptable medical practice, historically had far reaching reprecussions throughout Europe. 




