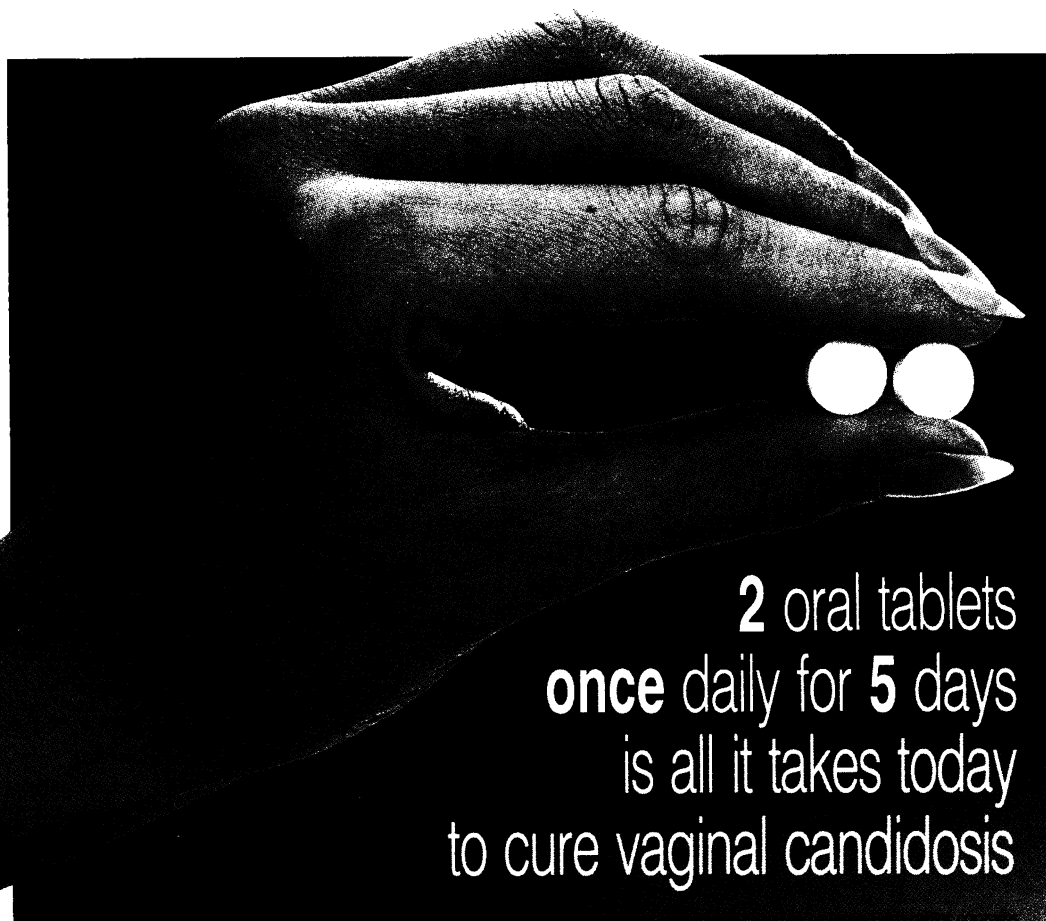

the plasma levels of ketoconazole are not less than 100 ng/ml. The plasma levels of ketoconazole should be monitored in patients with liver disease. It is important to monitor the following side effects: nausea, skin rash, headache, dizziness, and changes in taste. In two open trials have occurred in patients on ketoconazole, severe liver toxicity has been reported with an incidence of about 1 per 10,000 patients. Some of these patients have died. If signs and symptoms suggestive of hepatitis, treatment with ketoconazole should be stopped. Mild elevations of liver enzymes, on the other hand, do not necessitate discontinuation of the treatment.

One of the *BMJ*'s most popular series, Sir James Howie's *Portraits from Memory* is now published as a complete collection. For this Memoir Club edition the author has provided three new portraits, an introductory self portrait, and an appendix in which he comments on the points raised in the widespread correspondence that resulted from the portraits' publication.

Sir James Howie's distinguished career has included appointments as professor of bacteriology in the University of Glasgow, director of the Public Health Laboratory Service, president of the Royal College of Pathologists, and president of the British Medical Association. This book is not about himself, however, but about the memorable personalities he has known in microbiology and in military, hospital, and academic medicine. Essential reading for all students of human nature.

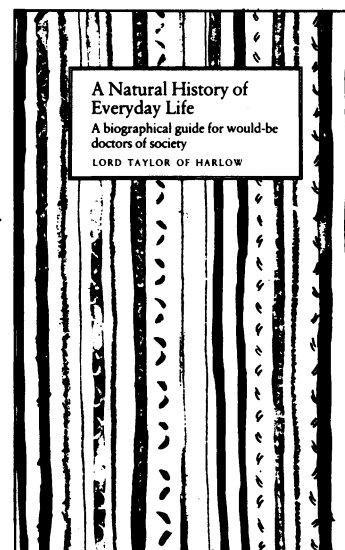

A Natural History of Everyday Life: A biographical guide for would-be doctors of society by Lord Taylor of Harlow

As doctor, politician, and administrator the late Lord Taylor was a key figure in the formative years of some varied institutions: the National Health Service; Harlow New Town (playing an important part in its development and in its industrial health service); and the Memorial University of Newfoundland, of which he was the first president and vice-chancellor. He also laid the foundations of Medicare in Canada by his skilful negotiations to resolve the doctors' strike in Saskatchewan. In his lively and provocative memoirs Lord Taylor relates his "personal voyage" from childhood, through student days at St. Thomas's to his later career in public life, providing on the way innumerable pungent observations together with his views on the origins of some of society's ills—and their cures.

Ryle was an outstanding clinician and an original clinical investigator, his work on the fractional test meal and the introduction of “Ryle’s tube” for taking gastric samples earning him an international reputation. With a holistic approach to medicine he saw the physician as a naturalist who must study how and why man reacts to disease as well as how disease progresses in man.

The awareness of a wider perspective led to his accepting the first chair of social medicine, at Oxford, where among his pupils was Michael Shepherd, now professor at the Institute of Psychiatry, who has written the introduction to the new Keynes Press edition of Ryle’s *The Natural History of Disease*.

First published in 1936, the collection of 34 lectures and essays is written in an unpretentiously clear and elegant style, setting out Ryle’s observations on disease states and the principles underlying his work and outlook. Startingly relevant today, it is also, as Michael Shepherd says, a classic in its own right.



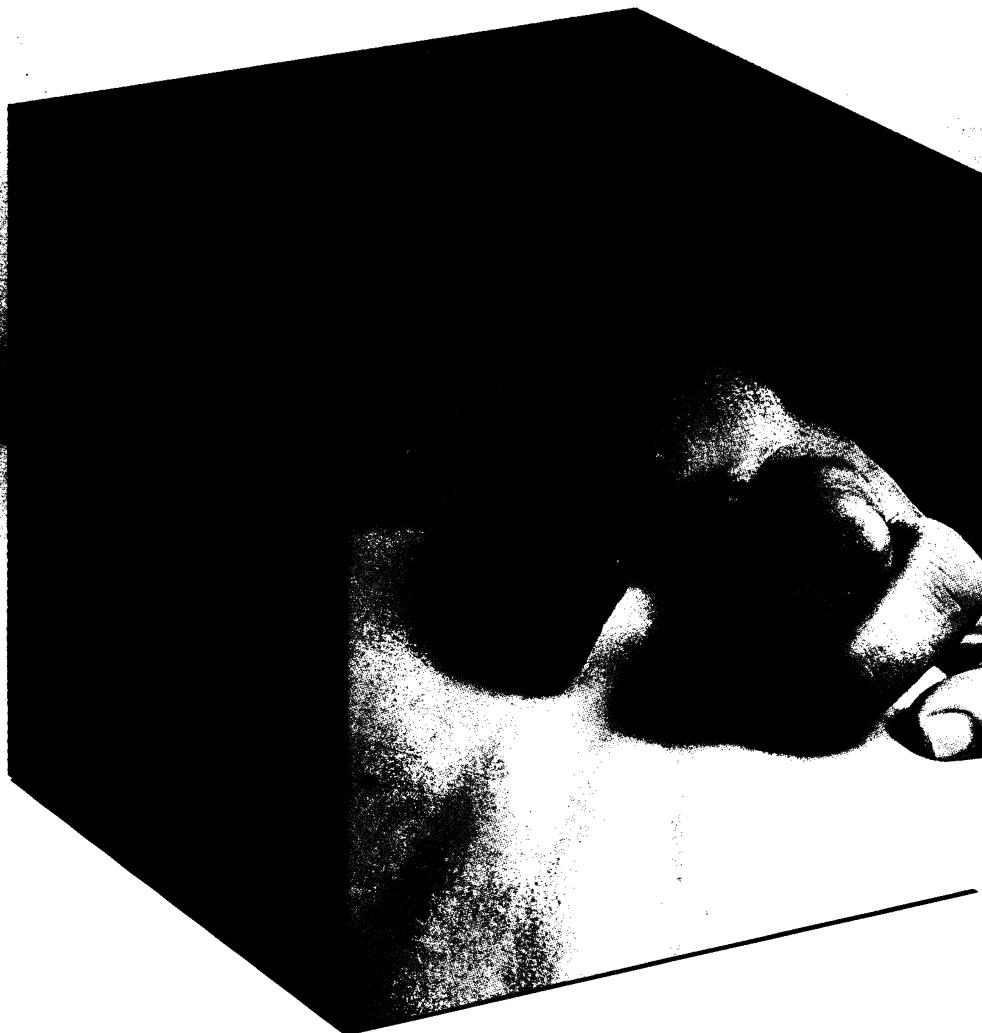
